Adoption Statement

In accordance with Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulation 2004, notice is given that the Lake District National Park Authority formally adopted the Cumbria Wind Energy Supplementary Planning Document on 16 October 2007.

The Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) sets out the Lake District National Park Authority's guidance for assessing proposals for non-domestic wind energy developments.
