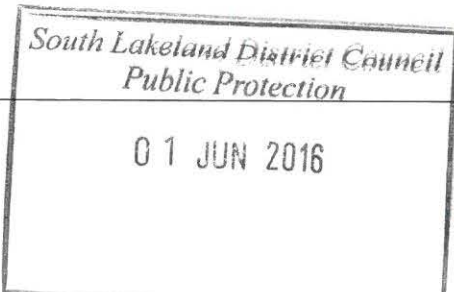

<p>Details of proposed variations (Please see Guidance Note 3)</p> <p>The proposed variation is to remove the following conditions from the premises licence:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- <i>No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be admitted to the premises at any time that the premises are open to the public.</i>- <i>All fire doors will be maintained effectively self closing and shall not be held open other than by approved devices. (This is duplicating separate legislation and is dealt with in the Fire Risk Assessment).</i>- <i>Notices detailing the actions to be taken in the event of fire or other emergencies, including how the fire brigade shall be summoned, are to be prominently displayed. (This is duplicating separate legislation and is dealt with in the Fire Risk Assessment).</i>- <i>Anyone who appears to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol must be required to produce proof of age before such a sale is made. (This is replaced with Challenge 21 below)</i>- <i>Beer garden to be cleared by 22.30 (This is replaced with the condition below).</i>

A "Challenge 21" Policy shall be adopted and enforced at the premises whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 21 shall be required to provide identification to prove that they are over the age of 18 before they are permitted to purchase alcohol. The only forms of acceptable identification will be:

- A Passport;
- A UK Photocard Driving Licence;
- Official ID card issued by HM Forces or EU bearing a photograph and the date of birth of the holder;
- Any other form of identification agreed with a representative of the Police Licensing Unit.

There will be no consumption of alcohol in the external areas after 22.30.
