Films are also shown outdoors mainly during the peak summer months, weather permitting. Live music and other regulated entertainment outdoors again will happen during the peak summer months.

With regard to the outdoor activities, they do not occur on a daily or even weekly basis. The days and hours simply provide flexibility in booking the events. These are events already taking place outdoors at other Parks within the estate and do not cause any adverse effect on the licensing objectives, nor will they at this Park. The Parks management will ensure the licensing objectives are promoted and that no-one is caused a nuisance as per the existing Operating Schedule. Given the location of the premises this would be extremely unlikely in any event. The remaining conditions on the licence are appropriate to ensure the licensing objectives are promoted. No further conditions would be appropriate or proportionate.

Notes for Guidance

1. General Note: The minor variations process can only be used for variations that <u>could have no</u> <u>adverse impact of the promotion of any of the four licensing objectives</u>. (These are: the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm).

It cannot be used to:

- · extend the period for which the licence or certificate has effect;
- transfer the licence or certificate from one premises to another;
- · specify, in a premises licence, an individual as the premises supervisor
- · add the sale by retail or supply of alcohol as an activity authorised by a licence or certificate;
- authorise the sale by retail or supply of alcohol at any time between 11pm and 7am;
- authorise an increase in the amount of time on any day during which alcohol may be sold by retail or supplied;
- include the alternative licence condition referred to in section 41D(3) in a premises licence.

2. <u>Description of premises</u>. For example the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. This should include any activities in or associated with the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups, the presence of gaming machines, etc.

- Relevant further details, for example whether music will be amplified or unamplified;

- Any seasonal variations in timings, e.g. additional days during the summer;
- Non-standard timings, e.g. where you wish the activity to go on longer on a particular day such as Christmas Eve.

b) Variations to premises/club layout: If you are applying for a variation to the layout of your premises, you must include a revised plan. You should be aware that your application is likely to be refused if the proposed variation could:

- increase capacity for drinking on the premises;
- affect access between the public part of the premises and the rest of the premises or the street or public way, e.g. block emergency exits or routes to emergency exits; or
- impede the effective operation of a noise reduction measure.

c) Revisions, removals and additions of conditions: The minor variation process may be used to remove conditions which are out of date or invalid and to revise conditions which are unclear (as long as the intention and effect remains the same). It can also be used to add a new condition volunteered by the applicant or mutually agreed between the applicant and a responsible authority, such as the police or the environmental health authority (subject to impact on the licensing objectives).

d) Variations to opening hours: Details of any changes to hours when the premises or club is open to the public.

4. <u>Further information</u>: You should use this box to provide any additional evidence to support your claim that the proposed variation is 'minor' and could not have an adverse impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives.
