The system shall be in operation during all hours that the premises is undertaking licensable activities."</p> <p>1.1.2 Images recorded by the CCTV system will be retained for a minimum of 14 days and be made available to the police and authorised officers of the licensing authority upon request being made pursuant to the Data Protection Act 1998. Images will be provided within 24 hours of being requested.</p> <p>1.1.3 Clear written instructions are to be displayed in the immediate vicinity of the CCTV hard drive to enable any member of staff to copy CCTV images on to a recordable format.</p> <p>2. Pub Watch</p> <p>2.1 The designated premises supervisor or a person nominated by them shall actively participate</p>
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and be a member of a Pub and Club watch scheme for the area within which the premises is located.

This is to replace the existing condition that reads "Members of Pub watch" - Annex 2, The Prevention of Crime & Disorder, point 6.

3. Incident Book

3.1 An incident book shall be maintained to record any activity of a violent, criminal or antisocial nature. The record will contain the time and date, the nature of the incident, the people involved, the action taken and details of the person responsible for the management of the premises at the time of the incident.

3.1 The incident book shall be available for inspection at all times a licensable activity is being conducted by an authorised officer of the relevant responsible authority. The records will be retained for at least 12 months.
