Notes for Guidance

1. General Note: The minor variations process can only be used for variations that <u>could have</u> no adverse impact on the promotion of any of the four licensing objectives. (These are: the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm.)

It cannot be used to:

- extend the period for which the licence or certificate has effect;
- transfer the licence or certificate from one premises to another;
- specify, in a premises licence, an individual as the premises supervisor
- add the sale by retail or supply of alcohol as an activity authorised by a licence or certificate:
- authorise the sale by retail or supply of alcohol at any time between 11pm and 7am;
- authorise an increase in the amount of time on any day during which alcohol may be sold by retail or supplied;
- include the alternative licence condition referred to in section 41D(3) in a premises licence.
- 2. <u>Description of premises</u>. For example the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. This should include any activities in or associated with the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups, the presence of gaming machines, etc.
- 3. Give full details of all the proposed variation(s). Failure to provide sufficient information may lead to the refusal of your application.  - a) Variations to licensable activities/licensing hours (all timings should be given in 24 hour clock (e.g. 16.00). Only give details for the days of the week when you intend the premises to be used for the activity), such as:
 - Whether new or increased levels of licensable activities will be taking place indoors or outdoors. Indoors may include a tent;
 - Relevant further details, for example whether music will be amplified or unamplified;
 - Standard days and timing when the activity will take place, including start and finish times;
 - Any seasonal variations in timings, e.g. additional days during the summer;
 - Non-standard timings, e.g. where you wish the activity to go on longer on a particular day such as Christmas Eve.
 - b) Variations to premises/club layout: If you are applying for a variation to the layout of your premises, you must include a revised plan. You should be aware that your application is likely to be refused if the proposed variation could:
 - increase capacity for drinking on the premises;
 - affect access between the public part of the premises and the rest of the premises or the street or public way, e.g. block emergency exits or routes to emergency exits; or

- impede the effective operation of a noise reduction measure.
- c) Revisions, removals and additions of conditions: The minor variation process may be used to remove conditions which are out of date or invalid and to revise conditions which are unclear (as long as the intention and effect remains the same). It can also be used to add a new condition volunteered by the applicant or mutually agreed between the applicant and a responsible authority, such as the police or the environmental health authority (subject to impact on the licensing objectives).
- d) Variations to opening hours: Details of any changes to hours when the premises or club is open to the public.

GENERAL:

CCTV sited: Sanctuary Bar, Reception, Function Bar, Restaurant, Leisure Club And over Front Door

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER:

Incidents of crime and disorder which occur on or near to the premises which, cause concern to the DPS or other employees of the venue will be recorded in writing

PUBLIC SAFETY:

Where door supervision is required, in particular for 18th birthday parties, a minimum of 3 door staff to be on duty at all times

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

CCTV images are stored for 10 days

Refuse such as bottles shall be disposed of from the premises at a time when it is not likely to cause a disturbance to residents in the vicinity of the premises

No nuisance shall be caused by noise coming from the premises or by vibration transmitted through the structure of the premises

All eternal doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency

A noise monitoring devise shall be fitted within the premises and its limit set to the satisfaction of the Environmental Protection Department of South Lakeland District Council, as offered by the applicant. All equipment for the production of amplified sound shall be connected to this devise, and it shall remain in operation whenever live music, karaoke, discos, DJ's or other forms of amplified regulated entertainment is being provided

The licence holder of his/her representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises on every occasion the premises are used for regulated entertainment and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a disturbance to local residents. A written record shall be made of those assessments in a log book kept for that purpose and shall include, the time and date of the checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action. Checks shall also be made to ensure that all equipment used for the production of amplified sound is connected only to the noise limiting device and to no other source. These checks shall also be recorded in the log book

THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM:

No adult entertainment / services provided

A notice or notices shall be displayed in and at the entrance to the premises where they can be clearly seen and read and shall indicate that it is unlawful for persons under the age of 18 to purchase alcohol or for any person to purchase alcohol on behalf of a person under 18 years of age.

Persons who appear to be under the age of 18 years shall be required to produce proof of age by way of a recognised proof of age card accredited under the Proof Of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) or Citizen card. If a proof of age card is not available a photo driving licence or passport.
