We have grounds to believe the license holder will fail to meet the licensing objectives of prevention of crime and disorder, as illegal working has been identified at this premises.

Section 36 and Schedule 4 of the Immigration Act 2016 (the 2016 Act) amended the Licensing Act 2003 (the 2003 Act) to introduce immigration safeguards in respect of licensing applications made in England and Wales on or after 6 April 2017. The intention is to prevent illegal working in premises licensed for the sale of alcohol or late night refreshment.

The Home Secretary (in practice Home Office (Immigration Enforcement)) was added to the list of Responsible Authorities (RA) in the licensing regime, which requires Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) to receive premises licence applications (except regulated entertainment only licences and applications to vary a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS)), and in some limited circumstances personal licence applications. In carrying out the role of responsible authority, Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) is permitted to make relevant representations and objections to the grant of a licence or request a review of an existing licence as a responsible authority where there is concern that a licence and related licensable activity is prejudicial to the prevention of immigration crime including illegal working

On 7th July 2017 Home Office Immigration Enforcement visited the following premises NAAZ RESTAURANT, 15 – 17 QUEEN STREET, ULVERSTON, LA12 7AF.

During this visit, immigration officers encountered the person/s subject to UK immigration control who were working illegally.

As the Immigration Enforcement team arrived outside the premises, two males ran from the kitchen when they saw uniformed officers outside. One of the males was apprehended and gave his details and admitted to officers that he was working at the restaurant and had been for a couple of weeks. He was also living in the basement of the restaurant. He said he had not shown any ID documents to the owner. One illegal worker was identified out of the 3 of workers present.

The owner was asked to provide evidence that the correct right to work checks had been conducted on employees. However, was unable to satisfy the immigration officer that had conducted the prescribed checks and therefore had no statutory excuse against liability for employing illegal workers.

A civil penalty for £10,000 was issued which is unpaid.

In addition on 08/10/2016 an enforcement visit was conducted to NAAZ RESTAURANT, 15 – 17 QUEEN STREET, ULVERSTON, LA12 7AF. Illegal workers were identified as working at the premises. Consequently a civil penalty was served for the employment of illegal workers for the amount of £45,000 and the amount remains unpaid.
