3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Films

Annex 2 - Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

The Prevention of Crime & Disorder

No irresponsible drinks promotions.

All members of staff concerned with the sale of alcohol to be trained with regard to the sale of alcohol and under 1 8#s.

The DPS shall have at least 2 years experience of managing similar premises in a similar capacity and with a similar terminal hour.

A personal licence holder shall be on the premises at all times during which intoxicating liquor is being sold and supplied to customers, or consumed by customers, except in the case of an emergency.

Any person who looks or appears to be under the age of 18 shall be asked to provide identification that they are over the age of 18. The following are the only forms of identification acceptable: UK photo

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driving licence, Passport or PASS card (proof of age standards scheme).

Public Safety

Daily safety audit to be carried out and a logbook to be maintained.

A first aid box on the premises and a first aider on the premises.

Fire extinguishers on the premises.

Fire exits clearly signed.

Emergency lighting.

Smoke alarm/ heat detectors.

No drunk, unruly or disorderly people to be allowed entry to the premises.

Emergency exits will remain unobstructed at all times.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Calling taxis for customers to ensure they are moved off the premises quickly and quietly.

The Protection of Children from Harm

All members of staff concerned with the sale of alcohol to be trained with regard to the sale of alcohol to under 18's.

All persons between the ages of 16 and 18 must be accompanied by an adult/guardian/someone over the age of 18.

No children under the age of 14 to be allowed in the bar.

Regulatory Reform (Special Occasions Licensing) Order 2002

The premises may remain open for the sale of alcohol from the end of standard hours on New Year's Eve until the start of standard hours on New Year's Day (or if there are no standard hours on the following day, Midnight on 31 December)

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

a)__During the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;

b)__During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;

c)__During the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;

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d)___Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;

e)__The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the dispatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;

f)_ The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;

g)_ _The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

h)_ The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or

i)__The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or

j)__The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to person employed there for the purposes of business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

Public Entertainment

Provision may be made for public entertainment in the premises by the reproduction of wireless (including television) broadcasts or of programmes included in any programme service (within the meaning of the Broadcasting Act 1990) other than a sound or television broadcasting service, or of public entertainment by way of music and singing only which is provided solely by the reproduction of recorded sound.
