Notes for Guidance

1. General Note: The minor variations process can only be used for variations that <u>could have no</u> <u>adverse impact of the promotion of any of the four licensing objectives</u>. (These are: the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm).

It cannot be used to:

- extend the period for which the licence or certificate has effect;
- transfer the licence or certificate from one premises to another;
- · specify, in a premises licence, an individual as the premises supervisor
- add the sale by retail or supply of alcohol as an activity authorised by a licence or certificate;
- · authorise the sale by retail or supply of alcohol at any time between 11pm and 7am;
- authorise an increase in the amount of time on any day during which alcohol may be sold by retail or supplied;
- include the alternative licence condition referred to in section 41D(3) in a premises licence.
- 2. <u>Description of premises</u>. For example the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives.
