Planning permission (application reference 7/2019/5123) for the creation of the external roof terrace was granted on 2 July 2019. The reason for this application is that there is currently no external space for customers to sit outside. The applicant considers that this puts the pub at a competitive disadvantage during periods of good weather when Bowness can be very busy. Part of the works also include the creation of a new bin store on the ground floor as shown on the proposed licensing plan. Please note that the amendments to the licensing plan are not to take effect until such times as the works are complete, and the Licensing Authority are notified.

As part of the application we are also seeking to extend the opening hours to allow the premises to open daily from 8am to offer breakfast, coffee and tea etc. Those existing Annex 2 conditions we are seeking to remove are now either outdated or covered by the mandatory conditions or other existing primary legislation. Due to the deregulation of the Live Music Act 2012 the premises would be permitted to have regulated entertainment take place outside on the external roof terrace from 08:00 to 23:00 daily, and the existing condition requiring seven days' notice to be given to the licensing authority and police should the applicant seek to have regulated entertainment outside after 22:00 is disapplied. After 23:00 any regulated entertainment could only take place indoors in line with the terms of the Premises Licence.

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence –
- a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or;
- b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence, or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Licensing Conditions from 01 Oct 2014

- 1.(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

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- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3.(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

Mandatory Conditions Order 2014

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a)"duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(1);
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

 $P = D + (D \times V)$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

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(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2: Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

1) Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during standard hours. Standard hours as stated on licence.

Regulatory Reform (Special Occasions Licensing) Order 2002

The premises may remain open for the sale of alcohol from the end of standard hours on New Year's Eve until the start of standard hours on New Year's Day (or if there are no standard hours on the following day, Midnight on 31 December)

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a) Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- b) The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- c) The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to person employed there for the purposes of business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

The Prevention of Crime & Disorder

No irresponsible sales promotions of alcoholic beverages shall be offered to customers. No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be admitted to the premises at any time the premises are open to the public.

A sign will be displayed on the premises indicating the standard hours during which the sale of alcohol is permitted.

Public Safety

All fire doors will be maintained effectively self-closing and shall not be held open other than by approved devices.

Notices detailing the actions to be taken in the event of fire or other emergencies including how the fire brigade shall be summoned are to be prominently displayed.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

No regulated entertainment of any type shall take place outside the premises in any areas which are

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within the licence holders control after 2200 save for any special event seven days notice of which has been given to the licensing authority and police.

When amplified musical entertainment is taking place inside the premises after 2200 windows and doors save for entrance and exit purposes will be kept shut.

A sign will be located at the exits(s) requesting that customers leaving the premises do so quietly and with consideration to neighbours.

The Protection of Children from Harm

No one under the age of 16 will be allowed to enter or remain on the premises after 2200 save on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

Anyone who appears to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol must be required to produce proof of age before such a sale is made.
