A Grade II listed Victorian Gothic mansion situated within the grounds of Fallbarrow Holiday Park overlooking Lake Windermere. The building comprises 18 bedrooms, including two self-contained apartments, with several communal social areas spread over 4 floors. The hall has its own outdoor recreation / garden space.

The use of the premises will be a multi-use venue ranging from holiday accommodation, seminars, corporate and training events, weddings and social occasions. The venue is open to persons staying at the hall and their bona fide guests, guests invited to attend functions and events by the Premises Licence Holder and employees of the owners and their bona fide guests.

1. This venue is open to the following persons:
 - a) Those staying at the hall and their bona fide guests
 - b) Guests invited to attend functions and events at the hall
 - c) Employees of Parkdean Resorts Group and their bona fide guests

b) **The prevention of crime and disorder**

1. Security staff will patrol the whole site internally and externally between the hours of 18:00 – 07:00 the following morning.
2. The premises is to operate an effective CCTV system which is to be maintained in good working order at all times the premises is open for business. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that the CCTV is operated in accordance with the latest Information Commissions Officers Guidance and is compliant with the relevant provisions of the Data Protection Act 1998.
3. The Premises Licence Holder shall retain recordings of the CCTV footage for a maximum period of 28 days. The CCTV system shall monitor both internally and externally throughout the public areas.
4. A record will be maintained at the premises of any incidents of crime and disorder including date and time, details and/or descriptions of the people involved, the location of the incident and which staff were present when the incident took place. Records will be made available upon request to an authorised officer of the local authority or Police and shall be retained for a period of 12 months.
5. Any faults with the CCTV system shall be documented.

6. A record will be maintained at the premises of any: refusal for the sale of alcohol or, visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

c) Public safety

1. Risk assessments will be regularly undertaken with regard to escape routes, fire precautions, first aid, the needs of disabled patrons, lighting and electrical equipment.
2. Fire risk assessments will be carried out to determine safe capacities in all internal public areas of the hall.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

1. The sale of alcohol in any outdoor area of the premises, as identified on the plan, will be limited until 2300 hours only.
2. During any outdoor entertainment, staff shall monitor the area to ensure that local residents not staying in the park are not disturbed.
3. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting that customers respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly

e) The protection of children from harm

1. Any person who is authorised to sell alcohol at the premises will be provided with training on first appointment and on a regular basis thereafter. Training will include information on how to prevent underage sales and any other relevant matters. A record will be kept of all training provided for 12 months and this record will be kept on the premises for inspection by any Responsible Authority.
2. The only acceptable forms of identification allowed will be a valid passport, valid photo ID driving licence, UK armed forces military ID or valid proof of age scheme card with the PASS approved hologram.



 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance

 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
